MICHAEL COONROD is recently retired from Interlochen Center for the Arts where he taught and performed for 46 years. He has mentored thousands of students and has given recitals and master classes at the Amalfi Coast Music Festival in Italy; the Eastman School of Music; the Chopin Academy of Music in Warsaw, Poland; and conservatories in Shanghai and Qingdao, China. His Doctor of Musical Arts was earned at the Peabody Conservatory in Baltimore, Maryland. He has four professional recordings, predominantly music by Franz Schubert.

Currently, Dr. Coonrod divides his time between his wife, three grown children with four grandchildren, playing chamber music recitals, working with the Boy Scouts of America, and serving as the choir accompanist for Central United Methodist Church in Traverse City. He enjoys wilderness hiking, camping, canoeing, scuba diving, and working on his HO scale model railroad creating a diorama of his home town of Missoula, Montana with the Bitterroot and Rattlesnake mountains, and the Clark Fork and Bitterroot rivers.
