### **DIRECTOR'S NOTES**

Being defined by other people is infuriating.

I've been thinking a lot about our forward-facing selves and the switches we make depending on each circumstance we find ourselves in. Often it is the case we are thrown into situations for which we have no means of understanding or ways of handling. They come upon us when we are developmentally not ready. When I was one, my father had his first heart attack. When I was 10, another. I wasn't allowed to see him in the hospital. I was literally left alone in the waiting room feeling scared and deeply embarrassed. I did not have the means or confidence to express myself and I felt stupid. When I was 15, he had ten percent blood flow to his heart and by 23, he was gone. I can't say how this major event in our family affected me when I was so little but the fear and worry my mother felt had to be palpable. And perhaps that transfer of fear and worry took root long before I could name it.

This embarrassment and shame stuck with me for a very long time. What I showed to the world was very different than what I allowed myself to feel when alone, safely in my bedroom. And as I grew up, it was imperative that different sides of myself were pushed forward to handle the situation. To survive, to get, to succeed, to make it through, I had to find my courage. Or I had to be willing to lose my temper. Or I had to admit I was sad and scared. I had to be brave enough to say that I was proud of myself. The constant awareness of how others would perceive me started so long ago and it has been a knitting-back together ever since. I see these fractures in Matilda. I see them in Miss Honey. Both have suffered profound mental and verbal abuse and they individually find mechanisms to survive the cruelty. The mending of our wounds takes time and it takes many, many false starts. When Miss Honey and Matilda finally find the safe space of the other the need for separate selves gives way. And they, and we, find strength enough to be everything all at once.
