Perform alongside world-famous musicians like Yo-Yo Ma

In March 2026, famed cellist and champion of arts education Yo-Yo Ma will give the world premiere of a new cello concerto by Wynton Marsalis with the Interlochen Arts Academy Orchestra in side-by-side performances with members of the National Symphony Orchestra and The Philadelphia Orchestra. These performances will take place on Interlochen's campus, at the Marian Anderson Hall in Philadelphia, and at The Kennedy Center in Washington, D.C. Ma is just one example of the many guest artists music students can meet and learn from during their time at Interlochen.



Work with premium theatre equipment like a *Hamilton*-style turntable

Thanks to generous donors, Interlochen's theatre students can rehearse and perform with moving stage parts like a push stick and a rotating turntable similar to the one used in Broadway's smash hit *Hamilton*. These top-tier tools allow for creative movement patterns and innovative staging, while giving students hands-on experience with equipment they will encounter in professional theatres.

Participate in the legendary "Elaine's Week" with a world-renowned museum consultant

Every fall, Visual Arts majors take a master class with Elaine Gurian, who has served as a senior consultant with the Smithsonian Institution, deputy director for the National Museum of the American Indian, first head of the National Museum of African American History and Culture, and more. She teaches Interlochen students creative installation techniques with a focus on making exhibits accessible to a broad audience. Through interacting with guest artists like Gurian, visual arts students hear industry-leading perspectives and begin to envision how their art will shape and inform culture.

Work on professional film projects through the Interlochen Cinema Collective

Film & New Media students at Interlochen participate in hands-on projects with the Interlochen Cinema Collective—a network of Interlochen alumni, faculty, students, and visiting artists dedicated to creating fully realized, professional-caliber films. In 2024, their short film "Jedo's Dead" was the winner of the Texas Shorts Competition at the SXSW Film & TV Festival, earned Best U.S. Short Special Mention at the Palm Springs International Shortfest, and won Best Short at the Minnesota Film Festival. The Collective's next project, a feature-length documentary about regenerative agriculture, is currently in production.

Dance in a 25,000 square-foot facility overlooking Interlochen's Green Lake

Interlochen's Dance Center features eight-foot-high windows with stunning lakeside views, 16-foot ceilings, sprung floors, and an outdoor deck space. Arts Academy Dance students hone their technique, dance to live accompaniment, and practice for two annual ballets in spacious, light-filled studios. Surrounded by beauty, students are inspired to reach for new technical heights.


