Thomas Lymenstull, Instructor of Piano at Interlochen Arts Academy from 1998 to 2024, has performed throughout the United States, and in Japan, China, and Europe. He won first prize in the Joanna Hodges (now Virginia Waring) Piano Competition and the Fresno Philharmonic Rotary Young Artists Competitions, and was a prizewinner in several other national and international competitions. Up to 1998 he was Associate Professor at the University of Southern California, where he was also a Teaching Fellow of the USC Center for Excellence in Teaching. Lymenstull has been a guest teacher and performer at conservatories, festivals, and music schools across the United States and in Japan, Korea, Singapore, Taiwan, Italy, and in over 20 cities in China. He is a frequent judge at competitions around the world, including Seattle, Washington D.C., Nagoya, Singapore, Shanghai, and Chengdu. Lymenstull received bachelor's and master's degrees and the Performer's Certificate from the Eastman School of Music, and the Doctor of Musical Arts degree from the University of Southern California. He studied both piano and conducting as a Fulbright Fellow in Vienna, Austria.
