SWAN LAKE Synopsis

Prologue: Years Later at a Shoreline by a Lighthouse

The melancholy Prince Siegfried walks toward a lighthouse, reflecting on the perceived love he lost years ago.

Act I, Scene I: A Forest at Night

The princess Odette and her friends venture to the forest before they are kidnapped by mysterious creatures under the command of Baron Von Rothbart. They are cursed and held captive as swans by day and maidens only late at night within the confines of the lake. The spell can only be broken by true love sworn to Odette.

Act I, Scene II: A Courtyard by Prince Siegfried's Palace

Courtiers merrily dance outside the palace as Prince Siegfried arrives to celebrate his birthday. His widowed Queen mother appears and reminds Siegfried that as future king he is obliged to propose to the neighboring kingdom's Princess Thalia. With hesitation, he is introduced to Thalia and her parents and later receives a hunting crossbow from his trusted confidant Benno as a birthday gift. Benno and his friends perform a series of dances to entertain everyone and distract Siegfried from his reluctant feelings. Evening falls and the party dances off back to the palace as Siegfried is left with Thalia, who tries to convince him to love her. Siegfried calmly rejects Thalia and is left alone with his thoughts. Benno convinces the resistant prince to go hunting by a nearby lake to take his mind away from his royal duties.

Act I, Scene III: The Lake

Rothbart appears by an obscure lakeside. He sees Siegfried and others approaching before hiding behind a ruin. Startled by Rothbart, the companions urge Siegfried to move onward, however his intrigue insists that he be on his own. Siegfried sees a light before the kidnapped maiden Odette appears. Frightened at first, Odette nervously tries to flee away but Siegfried warmly explains he means no harm and slowly begins to fall in love with her. Rothbart appears, breaking up their interaction as Siegfried tries to shoot him with his crossbow. Odette begs Siegfried not to shoot as she will be doomed to remain under the spell forever should Rothbart die. He complies and Rothbart summons more of his captive swan maidens as Odette and Siegfried continue to be enchanted by each other. Dawn approaches and Siegfried is about to swear his love to Odette before Rothbart arrives and sends Odette and her fellow maidens back to the lake as swans. Benno reappears, urging the prince to return to the palace as Rothbart ominously vows to destroy the love between Siegfried and Odette.

-INTERMISSION-

Act II, Scene I: The Palace Ballroom of King and Queen Hoffman

A ball is being held in celebration of Siegfried's forthcoming engagement to Princess Thalia at her parents' palace. A jester and guests from neighboring lands have been invited to dance for the occasion. Trumpets announce some unexpected guests: disguised as a handsome suitor, Rothbart arrives presenting Odile, a stunning woman clad in black with similar yet icy and sharper characteristics than Odette. Siegfried is immediately entranced and deceived by her allure. After the national dances, Siegfried dances with Odile under the watchful eye of Rothbart. Ignoring Thalia's continued advances and pressure from his surroundings, Siegfried is seduced by Odile's beauty and swears his love to her. With Odile's temptation, Rothbart tricks Siegfried and reveals the heartbroken Odette through the mirror, shattering it before triumphantly leaving the ball with his entourage further haunting the prince. The kingdom believes Siegfried to be insane and King Oliver commands the prince to be taken away to the asylum.

Act II, Scene II: The Asylum

Siegfried is locked in the asylum struggling under the palace guard's watch. Benno sneaks in and helps him escape to find his way to Odette.

Act II, Scene III: Rothbart's Lair

Rothbart conjures a violent storm to distract the prince from finding Odette. Siegfried eventually finds her by a lighthouse at Rothbart's lair, begging her to forgive him for his deception. An apparition of Odile appears which further confuses Siegfried as to his reality versus fantasy. Odette forgives Siegfried but leaves him alone as he remains only a painful reminder of her broken heart. The saddened Siegfried is apprehended by Rothbart and angrily tries to avenge himself before the villains attack and hold the prince hostage. Odette and her swan maidens appear, begging Rothbart to spare Siegfried. Realizing she will not find true love again, Odette ascends to the top of the cliff and jumps, drowning herself to death in the lake below. The distraught Siegfried uses his crossbow to strike the equally despondent Rothbart off the cliff to his death before himself fainting from exhaustion.

The clouds brighten and Siegfried awakes from the edge of the cliff. The royal family finds the prince and presents him to Princess Thalia, ignoring Siegfried's behavior as if Odette and Odile were a mere figment of his imagination. Benno places the crown on Siegfried as the prince honors his duty and agrees to marry Thalia-he is left alone with his imaginary thoughts and painstaking feelings of love and regret.
