Jeong-Suk Bae is the organ faculty at the University of St. Thomas where she teaches organ students and oversees the summer organ camp and annual Monaghan Organ Recital Series. She serves First Presbyterian Church Houston as the principal organist and the Co-Cathedral of the Sacred Heart as the assistant organist. She is regularly featured as the organist for Chorus Angelorum evensongs at the Cathedral of Our Lady of Walsingham and concerts with the Houston Chorale Society.

Dr. Bae has actively participated in the board of American Guild of Organists Houston Chapter, currently serving as the director of the Education Committee and coordinator for 2025 Pipe Organ Encounter in Houston.

Bae received her Doctor of Musical Arts in Organ Performance from the University of Houston under Roberts Bates and Matthew Dirst. Her former teachers include Albert Travis at Southwestern Baptist Theological Seminary (M.M., organ performance) in Fort Worth, Texas, and Jikang Jung at ChongShin Presbyterian University (B.M., piano performance) in Seoul, South Korea.
